Repetition Builds the Brain

Each time your child repeats an experience, their brain is building and strengthening connections.

Think of it like: A path being walked over and over → it becomes clearer and stronger

What Your Child is Learning Through Repetition

When children repeat experiences, they are developing:

Language – hearing and using words again and again

Thinking skills – understanding how things work

Confidence – “I can do this!”

Emotional security – knowing what to expect

Everyday Examples of Repetition

Reading the same bedtime story each night

Singing the same songs

Playing the same pretend game

Practicing climbing, building, or drawing

These moments may seem small, but they are powerful for brain development

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Repetition + Relationships = Strong Learning
